Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Report – Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSA) 2021 American Rescue Plan (ARP) 2021

Remington College (OPE ID: 030265) received education stabilization funds under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA) (Pub. L. 116-260), and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP) (Pub. L. 117-2). This Fund Report applies to the student portion received under the CRRSAA and ARP for the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) that is designated exclusively for emergency financial aid grants to students.

The institution is making the below information available for transparency purposes and in compliance with the U.S. Department of Education's ("Department") Notice of Public Posting Requirement of Grant Information for Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) Grantees published on May 13, 2021. An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. Remington College signed and submitted the Certificate and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) and by receiving the funds under the CRRSAA and ARP Remington has agreed to use the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP to award emergency financial aid grants to eligible students.
- 2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs. Remington College was notified on January 17, 2021 that the college would receive \$6,704,434 of the student portion of emergency funds as part of the CRRSAA. On May 20, 2021, Remington College was notified that the college will receive \$18,832,956 of student emergency funds as part of the ARP.
- 3. The total amount of emergency financial aid grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the initial report and every calendar quarter thereafter). For the quarter period of April 1, 2021 through June 30, 2021, both CRRSAA and ARP funds have not been distributed.
